# Music Notes

Create in Me a Clean Heart, O God by the American composer Carl F. Mueller (1892-1982) relies on text from Psalm 51:10-13. While the verses themselves provide the basis for a beautiful anthem the context of the Psalm helps provide additional meaning. The Psalm is headed, "For the leader; a psalm: for David (when Nathan the prophet came to him after he had taken Bathsheba)." This is one of the seven so-called "Penitential Psalms." David was anointed King but had sinned through murder, adultery, attempting to hide his sins, and by not repenting (see the full story in 2 Samuel chs. 11,12). He was confronted by Nathan and in 2 Samuel 12:13 David acknowledges his sins. Our Psalm text is David's plea to God for more than forgiveness but rather a new, "clean heart" and renewal of "a right spirit." David knew the story of Saul who was anointed King, sinned against God, but did not repent, and, "The spirit of the Lord had forsaken Saul..." (1 Samuel 16:14). This context reveals the power of God's forgiveness when one who is broken in sin confesses and fully and honestly repents.
