Music Notes

Throughout Advent we draw heavily from the writings of the book of Isaiah and William Rowan's (1951-) *Prepare the Way of the Lord* is part of that prophetic focus. The text is taken from Isaiah 40:4-5. The Book of Isaiah is generally considered as three sections by different authors at different times. The first section, Chs.1-39, is filled with accusations against Israel and warnings of judgment to come. The tenor of the Book changes dramatically in Ch. 40 as the opening lines are "Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God." Israel has paid the penalty and been forgiven its sinfulness. A shining future lies ahead. In our verses, a new path is to be created for the return to Jerusalem and God's glory will be seen by "all flesh" – a revelation not only for Israel but for all people.

Lo, how a rose e'er blooming is a German Marian hymn. The literal translation of the German title is "A rose has sprung up." The author of the text is unknown but its first written appearance was in 1599. The music was composed by Michael Praetorius (1571-1621). The words are based on the prophecy of Isaiah that from "Jesse's lineage" will come the incarnation of a Messiah. Originally the work contained the two verses offered in our anthem this morning. If, however, you look to the version included in our hymnal (No. 163) you will see a 3rd verse. Perhaps it is no surprise that there are a variety of English translations of the text as well as added verses. While all translations hew to the spirit of the original poetry, the words vary significantly. For example, our first line, "Lo, how a rose e'er blooming, From tender stem hath sprung" has been translated as, "A Spotless Rose is blowing, Sprung from a tender root" or, "Behold, a branch is growing of loveliest form and grace." To recognize the commitment of those who created new poetry for this historic hymn, today we offer both the anthem and as Benediction Response the fifth verse added by the American musician and hymn translator Harriet Reynolds Krauth Spaeth.
