## Interim Minister Rev. Sally Ann Castle

Rev. Sally Ann Castle graduated summa cum laude from New Brunswick Theological Seminary in May 2016, receiving a Masters of Divinity degree and the Beardslee Prize for RCA History. She was ordained to the Office of Minister of Word and Sacrament by the Classis of Queens, Reformed Church in America on April 9, 2017. Her call is Specialized Ministry as an Intentional Interim Minister. Her passion is writing liturgy for contemporary worship settings.

As an Elder at the Church on the Hill in Flushing (COTH), she developed and implemented a Blue Christmas worship service to minister to grieving and despondent people during the holiday season. This service has been adopted by several other congregations in New York and across the nation. Responding to needs in our urban community, she helped initiate the Food for Kids program at COTH which provides weekend groceries for food insecure families.

In her ministry as a hospital chaplain in Far Rockaway, Queens, Sally Ann advocated for indigent and non-communicative patients. She also initiated Health Care Decisions Day, a program which educates patients and staff about advanced medical directives in order to encourage early informed decisions leading to a dignified death. This program is in its tenth year.

Sally Ann has also served as a nursing home chaplain in Bedford Stuyvesant, Brooklyn, where she wrote and

led weekly worship services for an ecumenical congregation. For seventeen years she served as the Sunday School Superintendent at The Community Church of Douglaston where she focused on mission and intergenerational worship. The children led the congregation in mission outreach projects in Queens and internationally.

After graduating from seminary, Sally Ann completed additional training through The Interim Ministry Network to qualify as an Intentional Interim/ Specialized Transition Minister. In this capacity, she has exuberantly helped faith communities prepare well for their future, providing empathetic pastoral care during organizational change and spiritual and emotional transition.

Dear Members and Friends of Church on the Hill,

This is a time of change and transition for Church on the Hill. One Pastor leaves, a Transitional Pastor comes, then, eventually, the Transitional Pastor leaves and a new Pastor comes. A journey of change. But one thing remains steadfast.

The church is not a building or a denomination, it is you the people, the congregation who gathers here to worship and seek God's direction for your future. Many of you have long and deep connections to this place and to one another. In the midst of much change, that will never change.

I will begin serving as your Specialized Transitional Minister (STM) on February 1, 2024. What is a Specialized Transition Minister you may be wondering? After graduating from seminary, I completed additional training through The Interim Ministry Network (IMN) to qualify as an STM. As defined by IMN, STM "practitioners leaven their ministry with the profound ability to pastor well during change and emotional and spiritual upheaval. The task of the STM is to assist the local church in clarifying a vision for future ministry while maintaining pastoral ministry during the pastoral search process."

I joyfully anticipate helping COTH prepare well for its future, while providing empathetic pastoral care during this journey of organizational change and spiritual and emotional transition.

Together we will embark on a journey of discovery. Together we will examine the traditions, history,

ministries, leadership, and outreach of COTH. Building on this rich history and heritage we will envision the future. Who are we? What is God calling us to do?

I am excited to shepherd COTH through this time of change and I look forward to meeting every person in the congregation. Please pray for me, the friends and members of COTH, and the greater community as we begin this journey together.
