Call to Confession

Friends, when you study Peter's story in scripture it's almost impossible to ignore how much he loved to ask questions. He asks Jesus: "What does the parable mean?" "Where are you going?" Gospel Reading

Matthew 18: 15-22

'If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a tax-collector. Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven. For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.' Jesus said to him, 'Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times.





Nominations for Consistory Election

In May, at our annual congregational meeting, Church on the Hill will elect **one (1) new Elder** and **one (1) new Deacon** to the consistory. At this time, the congregation has the opportunity to nominate members of the congregation to serve in this office. Members of the congregation are able to nominate themselves.

When discerning whom you might nominate to serve in this office, please keep in mind the following:

- Elders are women and men set apart for a ministry of care and oversight of all the ministries and members of the congregation. The elders are called to provide spiritual care to the members of the church and to the minister. They are to be people of spiritual commitment, desiring to love and serve both God and neighbor in the church and in the world.
- 2) Deacons are women and men set apart for a ministry of mercy, service, and outreach. Deacons are called to oversee the benevolences of the church and to care for those in material need. They are to be people of spiritual commitment and compassionate spirit, desiring to love and serve both God and neighbor in the church and in the world.
- 3) Nominations and elections are not a popularity contest in the church. Rather, we should prayerfully consider the character, wisdom, spiritual gifts, and talents of individuals that will contribute to the leadership of the congregation and the overall mission of the church.

After nominations are submitted, the nominations committee will present a slate to Consistory for approval. The Consistory-approved slate will then be presented to the congregation prior to the congregational meeting, at which, members will vote to elect our new Consistory member.
