About the Music

"Were We There" is composed by Craig Courtney with lyrics by Pamela Martin. We offered a different Courtney anthem on Ash Wednesday. As a lyricist, Martin is an important American writer. She has over 150 credited compositions. In addition to collaborating with Courtney, she has worked, among others, with Lloyd Larson (see below), Mark Hayes, and Victor Johnson – all of whom have works in the library of the COTH Choir.

From the introductory text to "When You Prayed Beneath the Trees": "The opening lines of this Christopher Idle text were inspired by the first three Gospels' description of our Lord praying in the garden of Gethsemane, and in the light of John 17:20 — I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word... The text weaves around the 'tree' theme found in many Scriptures about the cross..." Idle is a prolific hymn composer currently credited with over 300 compositions. The music for this anthem was composed by Lloyd Larson.
