About the Music

The "Cantique de Jean Racine" is one of the most beloved pieces of the COTH choir. It was composed by Gabriel Faure (1827-1924) in 1866. Jean Racine paraphrased a liturgical prayer in Latin into French and when Faure wrote the piece he named it after Racine rather than using any words from the text. Today we offer a two-part arrangement instead of the choir's standard four-part version. If you recall the words of the full choir arrangement, you will hear something very different today- today's translation is much closer to the original French text. Musically, there are two things to listen for. You will hear a calm, unhurried bass line. In the piano sections, you will also find a relaxed melody. But Sean will get a workout with triplets that run through the entire piece with no break.

"Thy Mercy, Jehovah" (Benedetto Marcello, 1686-1739) is a setting of Psalm 36: 5-7,9. This Psalm is one of two that is headed "A Psalm of David: a Servant of the Lord". The Hebrew word hesed in this Psalm is translated as "mercy" although in other Psalms it is translated as "unfailing love" or "lovingkindness"-a broader term encompassing both love and mercy. David paints in broad strokes throughout this Psalm-mercy, faithfulness, righteousness, judgements, heavens, clouds, great mountains, a great deep. Jehovah's world has ample potential to preserve "both man and beast"- all elements of creation. "...and in thy light shall we see a great light" seems to presage John 1: 6-9 in which John testifies that the light of Jesus "...gives light to everyone..."
