Music Notes

This week, Music Notes turns its attention to the hymns of the morning. Last spring, a Note was written on the information contained on the page of each numbered hymn (4/16/23). One of the information items noted was that when a hymn is based on a scriptural reference it is listed under the title. For this morning's "Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise" we see the reference to 1 Timothy 1:17. But now we add the fact that many hymns have multiple scriptural allusions and only the primary one is listed on the hymn page. In this case, there is also a reference drawn from Daniel (7:9) – the subject of Rev. Rivera's sermon series. The words are by Walter Chalmers Smith, a minister of the Free Church of <u>Scotland</u>. The tune's name is St. Denio (St. Denis; the patron saint of <u>France</u>), and the music is taken from a <u>Welsh</u> ballad. A truly international composition.

Our other hymn is "A Mighty Fortress is Our God"; recognized as the most powerful hymn of the Protestant Reformation. Composed by Martin Luther (1483–1546) between 1527 and 1529, the text is primarily original but there are references to Psalm 46. The hymn is central to the Lutheran tradition. Much has been written about this important hymn so here we will highlight only one aspect; English translation. There are said to be at least 60 English versions. In the U.S., the translation used historically by Lutheran congregations was adopted in 1868 and begins with the line: A mighty fortress is our God, a trusty shield and weapon. This was updated in 1978 and the first line was revised to: A mighty fortress is our God, a sword and shield victorious. Both translations highlight the nationalist elements of the hymn and align with its historical use as a battle hymn. Our translation is by Frederick Hedge completed in 1853.
